In the year 2023 of the Gregorian calendar, a **WAR** is being waged,

[like the current war in Ukraine and all those that have taken place in recent years in Latin America, Chile and Argentina, Afghanistan, the two wars in Iraq and the wars in Yemen and Syria, which have brought **infinite sorrow** upon humanity and resulted in **millions of refugees** – destroying people's homes and lives before turning them into "**People of the Tents**"; not to mention all the people who have been killed and therefore "*deprived of the right to speak*"; all the tragedies provoked by weapons; all those traumatised by war, along with their friends near and far, impoverished and forced to live in extreme conditions – tent cities or refugee camps, in foreign countries where people speak a foreign tongue – often separated from their loved ones for months or years]
